About the presenter:

Jack Jordan, PhD, is a licensed psychologist specializing in work with survivors of suicide and other traumatic losses for more than 45 years. He has published over 50 clinical and research articles, chapters, and full books in the areas of the practice of grief therapy, bereavement after suicide, support group models, the integration of research and practice in thanatology, and loss in family and larger social systems.

The suicide of a loved one can have a profound and sometimes devastating impact on those left behind, called suicide loss survivors. Bereavement after suicide may entail high levels of disorientation, guilt, regret, anger, shame, and trauma. Survivors may also be at risk for elevated rates of complicated grief and future suicidality themselves.

This workshop is designed specifically for mental health professionals who may provide grief therapy for suicide loss survivors. It will provide a focused overview of the impact of suicide on survivors, and the clinical and support responses that are needed after a suicide occurs.
